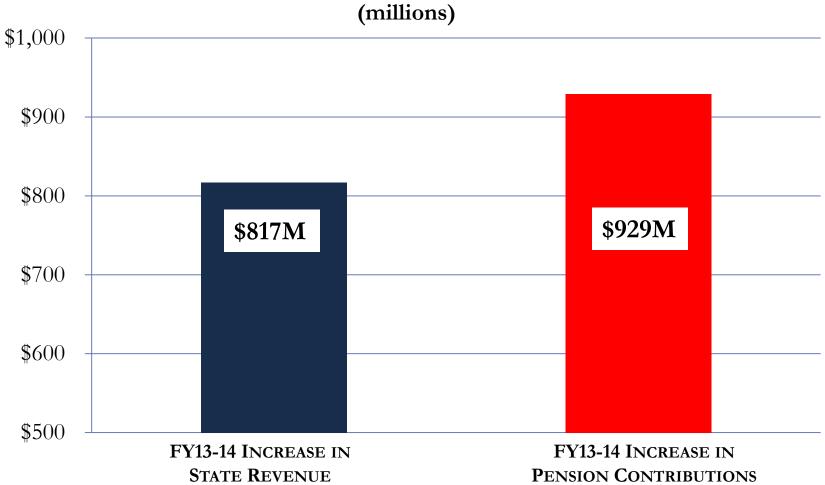

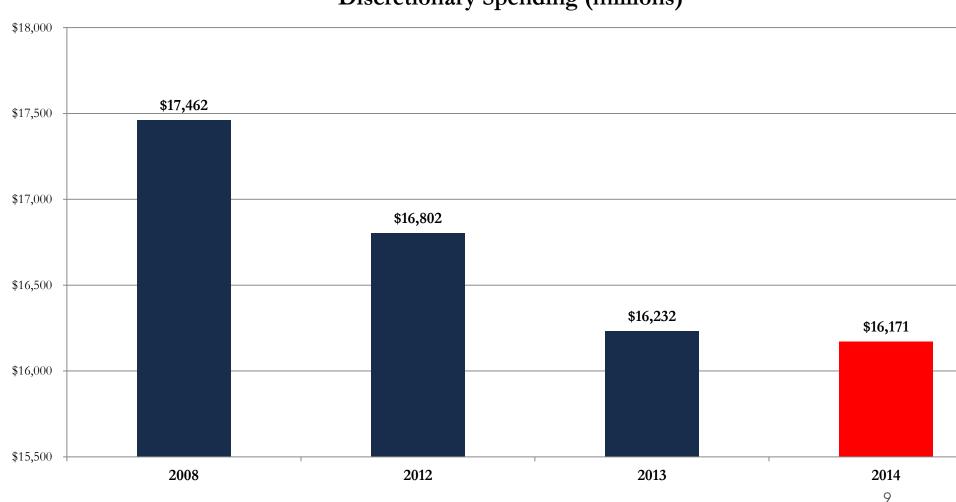

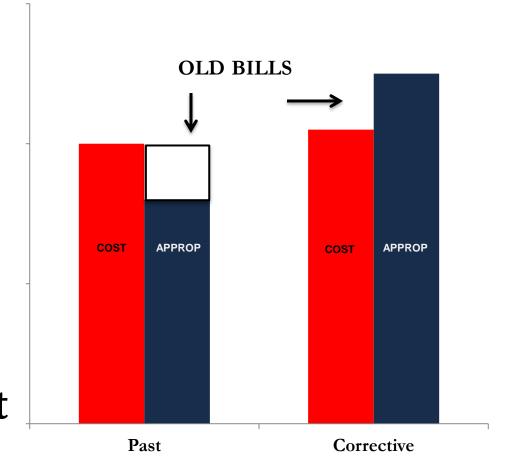
#### Discretionary Spending (millions)



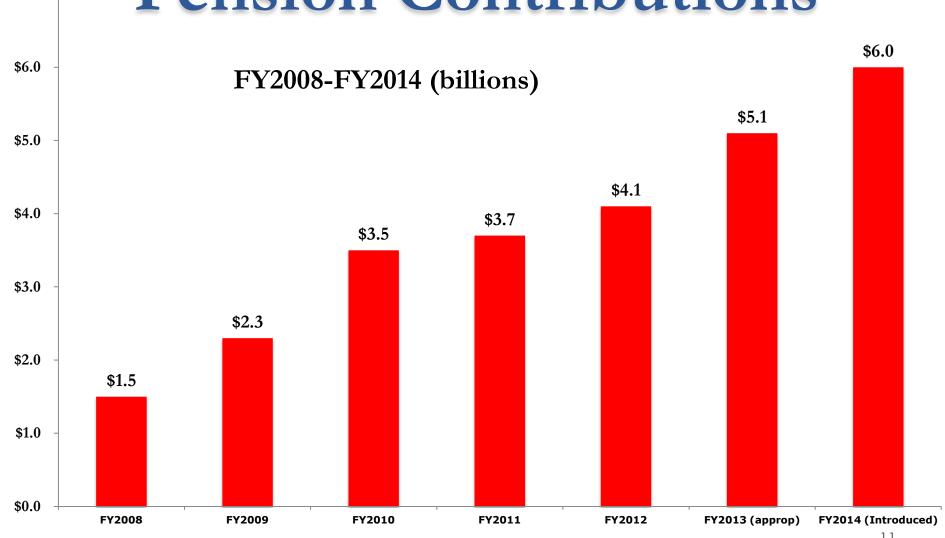

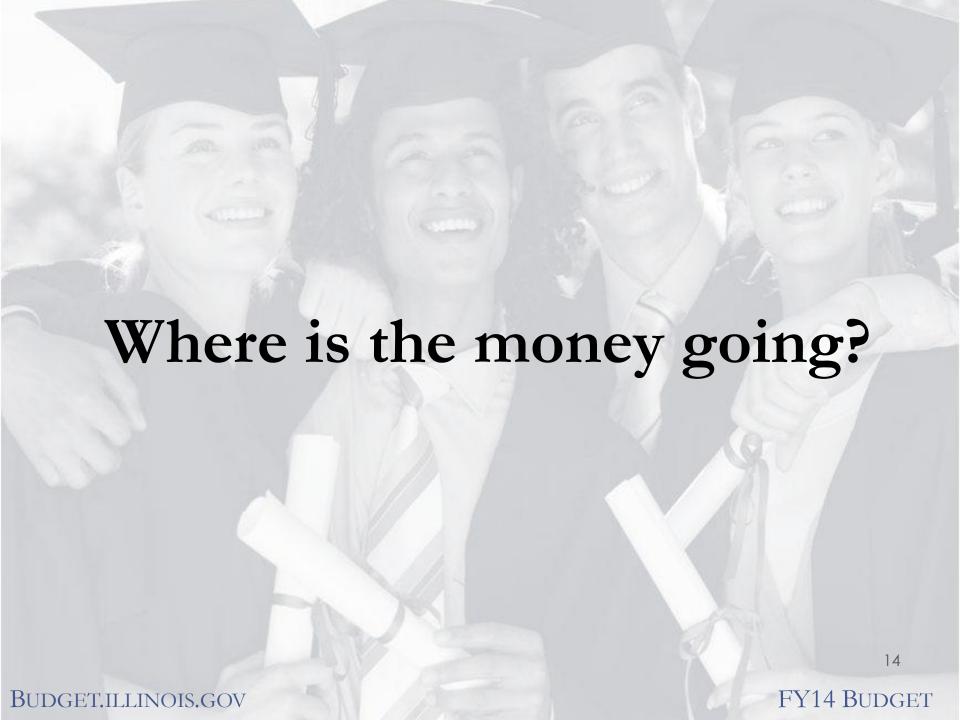

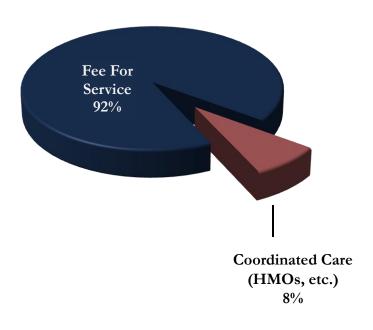
